GUEST SPEAKER: We want to thank Dave Aiken for his last financial tip: He brought up getting long term care insurance. You a buy it for a specific number of years you think you're going to need it. He found a program that he paid in on for 10 years and now gets yearly updates on what he will be entitled to once he starts needing the funding. Until that point it will go up 5% per year as to how much it will subsidize for him (it will not pay everything just a portion). The cost for nursing homes has gone from \$100 per day to over \$350 per day as he's been following the rates. As he finished his financial tip he repeated one he gave us in the past to remember to set up a mutual fund for our kids / grand kids even if it's just \$500 as it will grow and be able to help the kids for their education if they are young enough or with a house if they are older. Thanks for all the tips you've given us Dave we appreciate the time you took to help us be more financially aware.
